Times Table Rockstars (TT Rockstars)

TT Rockstars is a brilliant way to for your child to practise and learn their times tables outside of the school day. Your child can play on the website on any device or the app to earn coins for their avatar by practising their multiplication tables. Your child can also play a 'Rock Slam', which allows them to challenge someone else in their class, year group, or school.

The table on the right shows the 10 fastest people (staff and children) in the school and how quickly they can answer each times table question on average. Challenge your child to see if they can break into the top 10 over the Christmas break—if they aren't there already!
