To continue to develop the good work we do for pupils with Additional Needs at Leechpool, we have requested a West Sussex SEND and Inclusion Review. To enable this, two members of the SEND team were due to come into school on Thursday 26 May 2022 to look at the provision we offer here at Leechpool, as well as speaking to Governors, staff and pupils. Unfortunately this had to be postponed by them due to illness, so they will be coming in on Monday 27 June 2022 instead. Their feedback will help us ensure that we continue to offer the good provision already in place.


