Curriculum Development - Recovery and Catch up

This year we introduced the new half termly curriculum newsletter to keep all families up-to-date with the progress of the children and how the school is developing the curriculum to reflect the demands and challenges for young learners in today's Covid environment.

Over the last few weeks the staff have been working on the development of writing with a particular focus on grammar teaching.
