Attendance and Lateness



Attendance at school is very important and children should attend school when well enough to do so. Non attendance can create bad habits for children, and families need to ensure that the reason a child is not in school is fully justified.



Appointments such as the dentist should be made out of school time and family trips should be avoided whenever possible. The children attend school for 190 days and have 175 days/holidays to carry out family events.

Attendance of children in schools is a national issue and last week **15% of Leechpool children did not attend a full week**. Being on time for school is also very important. Last week **11.5 % of children were recorded as late** at Leechpool.

Junior children (Years 3—6) need to be in school, sat in the classroom and ready to learn by 8.45 a.m. Infant children (Years R—2) by 8.55 a.m.

Being on time for school is key for successful academic progress. Late arrivals disrupts and slows down the learning for the class, as teachers are having to repeat instructions multiple times.


There are a number of useful websites for families to use and we have listed these on our <u>school website</u>. Please ensure that you keep updated on the different trends so that you are best informed to support your children.

A request to Families

We are aware that many children in Key Stage 2 enjoy playing on—line games at home with their friends which we understand is a fun activity but could we ask that families ensure these activities are carefully monitored so that all children are using appropriate language and are considerate to each other. Leechpool staff should not be having to sort out on-line incidents and falling outs amongst children that have occurred during out of school hours. Thank you.

Curriculum Information

We are constantly updating our curriculum information for families on the school website and would encourage everyone to regularly check the website for updates.





We also produce half termly Curriculum and Inclusion Newsletters to focus on key areas of the curriculum and inclusion/mental well-being. For information on your child/children's progress we provide termly updates through a face to face meeting. We also encourage all families to contact their child's class teacher if they have any questions or areas of concern. This can be done by contacting the School Office or speaking to a class teacher at the end of the school day.

School Uniform

Thank you to everyone for ensuring that the school uniform policy is followed. The children all look very smart and they wear their uniform with pride.

Please <u>remember school jumpers and shoes should be worn every day – body warmers/thermal long sleve tops under polo shirrts are not considered school uniform. Children need to wear a school sweatshirt.</u>

Trainers should only be worn for sporting activities. Black school shoes should be worn during the school day.

Could we also ask that PE kits are brought to school on a Monday and taken home on a Friday for washing and checking, by all year groups. This will ensure that PE kits are regularly monitored and it should help to keep our lost property collection down.



Hair

- 1) For safety reasons, all long hair needs to be drawn back from the face and tightly secured (e.g. by hair bands).
- 2) <u>No extreme fashion hairstyles are acceptable</u> i.e. Mohicans, sculpted patterns, tramlines or shaved heads etc. If you are unsure please seek advice before cutting or styling your child's hair.
- 3) Ribbons, clips, headscarves etc. should be kept simple and to <u>school or hair colours.</u> Braiding and coloured beads are best kept for school holidays. We monitor this at all times.

Head lice

Whenever we have a case of head lice reported to the school, we do inform all families of the class and we ask that all families check the hair of their children and treat as necessary.

Remember to combat head lice all families have to take responsibility.

Parking Outside the school

Could we please ask you to ensure that at all times whilst parking near the school you are considerate of local residents and that you are vigilant regarding the safety of all our children.

All car users should ensure that they do not park on yellow lines or near the drop down pavements used for crossing the road by the children. Thank you.

School Office Opening times

The School Office opening times are from 8.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday. All families visiting the school should do so between these times only. Changes to pick up arrangements for children should **not** be emailed to the school. Parents need to speak to a member of staff by telephone before 2.00 p.m. Thank you.
