Staff News

This term we welcome two new members of staff to our school team: Miss Lloyd-Jones, our new Year 5 teacher and Upper Key Stage 2 Phase Leader; and in Early Years Foundation Stage Miss Emma Brown, who is the teacher of Koala Class.

Improvements over the summer holidays

During the summer holidays, a number of upgrades were made to the school building. These were:

- **Decoration of Year 1 classrooms and the school hall and other key areas around the school.**
- **Replacement of flooring in Hedgehog and Squirrel Class.**
- **Replacement cladding and upgrading to the Music Box.**
- **Electrical Compliance Test throughout the school and PAT testing.**
- **Improvements to the playground and the installation of a new play house for the new reception classes.**

A very big thank you to Mr Anderson (Maintenance Manager), Mr Smith and Mrs Wellcome (School Business Manager), for their co-ordination and completion of all the building works during the summer break. Sadly we have said goodbye to Mr Anderson who left the school at the end of August. We wish him the very best for the future in his new job.

Attendance Achievements

This aspect of the school's recording was relaxed in 2021-2022 due to the return after Covid. This will be reviewed by the office and children with good attendance during the last academic year will be acknowledged. Going forward the position is that **all children should attend school if they are able to**. We will be addressing all non attendance with families on a case by case basis in line with Government advice.

Over the coming weeks, the school will be sending out a data sheet for all families to update. We would appreciate it if families could do this as soon as they are received. This will be important for the families of Year 6 in preparation for Secondary Transfer.

End of Day Arrangements

All children in Years R, 1 and 2 are collected from the infant playground at the agreed staggered times. (See communication on 2nd September) The class teachers will dismiss the children out from their classes to you at the end of the day. All families are encouraged to carry this out as quickly as possible to ensure that we do not have queues forming.

We would also like to ask that all families follow the school policy of not allowing children on the climbing frames at the end of the day as they are not supervised by school staff and they are not large enough for all children of the school to be on the equipment at one time!! NO CLIMBING ON TREES AT ANY TIME.

Year 3 children will leave at the agreed staggered times and parents may collect them from the junior playground.

Years 4, 5 and 6 children are encouraged to make their own way out of school at the end of the school day at 3.00 p.m.



Meet the Teacher Sessions in School

Meet the Teacher sessions have been arranged for Years R–6 on Wednesday 14 September at 3.15pm – 3.45 p.m. or 6.00 – 6.30 p.m. Infant presentations will start at 3.15 and 6.00 p.m. and KS 2 presentations at 3.30 and 6.15 p.m. Presentations will last no more than 10 minutes.

The meeting is designed for you to personally meet your child's teacher and to find out about routines, homework and other curriculum related information. If you require an individual meeting with your child's class teacher could you do this by contacting the School Office. **We hope to see a family member for every child. Please try to attend your child's meeting; it really helps to develop good relationships. Meetings will be held in your child's allocated classroom. Children are welcome to attend.**

Pupils' Mobile Phones

Mobile phones should not be brought to school unless the families of Year 5 and 6 children have identified this as essential to help with travel arrangements to and from school. Phones must be named and handed to their class teacher at the start of the day. Pupils are not allowed to keep or use phones during the school day or on the school site. This policy is constantly being reviewed and we will be updating you of any changes as they occur.

PE

PE is a compulsory part of the National Curriculum and all children will need to bring their PE kit to school each Monday for PE days. Information regarding this was shared last term.



Painting Shirts

If possible, please provide your child with an old shirt (named) to wear over their uniform, when taking part in painting and other messy activities. If your child does get paint on their uniform the best way to deal with it is to soak the item of clothing in cold water before washing it. This allows the water-based paint that we use to lift out and not be set by any detergent or agents in washing powders.
