#### **Curriculum Support at home**

Last year we introduced the half termly curriculum newsletter to keep all families up-to-date with the progress of the children and how the school is developing the curriculum to reflect the demands and challenges for young learners in today's Covid environment.

Due to the disruption of closures and isolating to learning, the staff have been working on the development of writing with a particular focus on grammar teaching.
