<p>Led by Dan Barden and Eliza Graham, supported by staff and external coaches All classes receive 2 PE lessons per week, delivered by trained teachers Monitoring includes drop-ins, lesson observations and staff feedback PE team collaborates with TAs and external partners for inclusive access including local primary and secondary schools Pupil voice, Sports Council, attendance data at extracurricular clubs and competition data inform ongoing development to create an inclusive environment with inclusive participation</p>	<p>Curriculum develops physical skills, teamwork and personal challenge Units include gymnastics, invasion games, athletics, dance and swimming Interleaving curriculum revisits key skills to build progression Planning includes LO, progression steps and adaptations for all learners Focus on competition, personal bests and inclusive participation Children enjoy taking part in physical activity Children consistently show physical skills such as coordination, balance, and agility Children take pride in themselves and believe in their abilities Children face new challenges with confidence and learn from mistakes to improve</p>	<p>PE is taught twice weekly for all classes across the year Skills revisited across terms to support long-term development Fixtures and competitions take place throughout the year Staff training in key areas (e.g. dance, swimming, invasion games) is ongoing Active breaks, enrichment pick-up and sports days boost activity levels Swimming is taught in year 2, 3, 4 and 5 for a term each Students who are yet to meet the 25m aim for swimming are taken throughout the year to support them Big Run takes place each half term for all students Tour De Leechpool takes place annually</p>
